Growing the Mission of Our Association

Welcome to the first Lambda Sigma TKE Grenade. The Alumni Association of Lambda Sigma TKE is proud to have produced this newsletter and glad it found you. Our Association was founded in 2008 by 35 Charter Alumni. Our mission was to better support the chapter and chapter members through actively engaging the College and developing programs that would make the Chapter sustainable for the long term. With the emphasis on Scholarship we created a program consisting of 2 named awards that are managed through the TKE Educational Foundation. TKE Headquarters pitched in with 3 extra awards to help us kick off the program and as a result we were able to award 5 scholarships to Chapter members last year. This was a first for Lambda Sigma TKE. These Scholarships were made possible by generous donations from dedicated Alumni Fraters and outside donors.

In addition to the Scholarship Program we have established an active Board of Advisors that helps to oversee the Chapter. The Alumni Fraters volunteering in this role have worked hard to see that the Chapter is meeting it's obligations and living up to the standards set by the Alumni, the School, and by Headquarters. The Chapter has exceeded in most if not all areas.

In 2008, at the outset of the TKE Lambda Sigma Alumni Association, it was decided that if our efforts were to be successful we would need to pursue a new relationship with Keene State. I went to Keene and met with the Dir. of Alumni Relations Patty Farmer. She was supportive of our vision and commended the organization for taking such a positive step. She eventually asked me to volunteer for Keene State and sit on the Board of Directors for the KSC Alumni Association . Volunteering for KSC has been a great experience for me and given the TKE Chapter better opportunities to assist the college. As a result we were able to grow our mission and vision while helping the Chapter become a more beneficial organization to the College. Maintaining this relationship with Keene State is imperative to the future success of TKE Lambda Sigma.

Our Association has grown from a desire to see our Fraternity supported by it's Alumni Brothers and a belief that we could be a better Fraternity than ever before. Our resolve to carry out this mission has never been stronger.




