


The most incredible part of Conclave was being able to walk up to any Frater and strike up a conversation with a mutual understanding of our bond. Many at Lambda-Sigma seem to forget that we are a part of something far bigger than just our chapter. I met brothers from near (Maine, Rhode Island) and far (California, Minnesota, Florida, Alaska). It was amazing to compare chapter operations, traditions, and find out some of the common problems that we faced. There were so many different ideas and personalities it is hard to recount them all. Many chapters faced similar financial issues that Lambda-Sigma once did, and as a past Crysophylos, I was able to share some of our issues and how we handled them, with the help of the Board of Advisors and Alumni Association.
